The grandmother of the two preschoolers, Faybelle Forde, was extremely thankful. "Words can't express the feeling within me at this moment," remarked Ms. Forde. "I really wasn't expecting this valued contribution. The grandchildren are all excited and happy for everything, and I must let you all know this will not go unrewarded. I pray that the Father above will bless all of you in everything you do," concluded Ms. Forde.

The Caterpillars were given the task of developing a list of items that the children would need, and the list was then split between the Caterpillar students. The mentors, life coaches, staff and volunteers for the program also assisted the students in the effort.

On Saturday, the Caterpillars also made a special presentation to a local student with Down's Syndrome. The Caterpillars presented Nyah Robinson with a new backpack and school supplies from monies they raised during a fundraising campaign for children with disabilities as part of their July community service. Project Promise founder and president Resa O'Reilly said she is extremely proud of the students. "This was an extraordinary summer of giving for our Caterpillars! They exceeded all expectations and surpassed all the goals that were set forth for both July and August's service projects," said O'Reilly.
